The Greening of All Saints

Room Changes in our Church Building

When the Vestry heard that the Good Shepherd School is growing and needs more space, which is a very happy bit of news, we set about thinking of ways to bring the school downstairs.

One of our first plans involved clearing out the storage area across from the Sextons' Room, building a wall to separate that space from the table storage area off the parish hall, and making a room out of it, into which the Rector's Office would move.

Once underway, however, it was discovered that the floor has sunk in that area causing serious cracks in the wall. The Property Committee decided that the foundation would need to be shored up in that part of the building before the room can be used.

So there will be some moving, but not the Rector's Office. The Choir will move into the South Room once it is freshly painted and will share that room with space for meetings. The Youth Group will move up into the Tower once more, in the smaller room. The Good Shepherd Atrium for 6 to 10-year-olds will move into the choir room and the 3 to 6 year-olds will remain in their room behind the organ chamber.

This summer you will see these moves taking place and hopefully all will be ready by fall when our programs begin again.

Lambeth Conference to Take Place July 16 to August 3

This summer the Lambeth Conference meets in England. The Bishops of the Anglican Communion have attended this conclave once every ten years since its inception in 1867. There is no legislative authority in the Anglican Communion, only a stated spirit of unity. That unity is made more difficult now over questions of sexuality and the interpretation of Holy Scripture. Through our democratic process the Diocese of New Hampshire elected as their bishop a man living in a same-sex relationship and the General Convention of the Episcopal Church following approved that election. Bishops from countries with an autocratic process for the appointment of bishops do not understand, and have violated the autonomy of their colleagues by entering American Dioceses without permission of the Diocesan bishop and functioning as bishops – confirming, ordaining - within another's jurisdiction. A Listening Process has been defined by the bishops but making it work is not easy. The Archbishop of Canterbury hopes this year's Lambeth Conference will be a time for healing wounds and moving again toward

unity. In addition there is proposed a Covenant which would bind the members of the Anglican Communion more closely than before.

At All Saints we will have opportunities for discussion before and after the conference, and to learn what is happening apart from the sensational coverage that will no doubt be in our newspapers. Please plan to attend.

Treasurer's Report

April, 2008, was a good month. Pledge offerings of \$8,900 exceeded the budgeted amount of \$8,700. Total receipts of \$9,700 were less than the budgeted \$10,700. However, disbursements were also less than than budget by \$500; actual of \$14,500 vs. budgeted \$15,000. The "bottom line" was that the (deficit) for the month was only \$500 greater than budget - \$(4,800) vs. \$(4,300). Year-to-date for the four months ended April 30,2008 was better than budget as the year-to-date (deficit) is \$(700) compared to the budgeted (deficit) of \$(1,000). The following compares 2008 with the budget and with 2007;

GOOD SHEPHERD - GOOD NEWS

Our prayers have been answered as we were in need of an additional catechist and a larger space.

Now we ask that you keep Debbie Talbot-Miller in your prayers as it is with much joy that we announce that she will be attending her first Catechesis of the Good Shepherd formation course from June 23rd thru 27th and joining Jan Fritzsche, Lisa Czerny and I, Sandy Kynerd in the fall of 2008 as a catechist.

We are also happy to announce that we will be moving the older children's atrium to a much needed larger room (choir room). We will have 10 children attending next years 1st thru 4th grade.

Our last Sunday for the Good Shepherd atriums this year will be June 8th.

Our summer Sunday school will be held in the choir room again this year for all children ages 3 yrs thru 10 yrs. We will begin in June for three Sundays: June 15th, 22nd and 29th with a wonderful curriculum. Your children will watch in awe as Bible stories literally unfold before their very eyes. Each Bible story has a pattern to fold and cut as the story is told. Discussion questions about the story will allow the children to get involved both by having younger children help tell the story if they know it and by having older children help cut and fold the patterns. The figures created are key parts of the story, such as the snake, the tree, and the fruit for the Garden of Eden (Genesis 3); Moses in the basket (Exodus 1:2-10); Samson and his hair—which is cut off (Judges 16); The lion from Daniel and the lions' den (Daniel 6); A string of Wise men (Matthew 2:1-12); The fish from when Jesus fed 5,000 people (John 6:1-13; and more stories from both the New and Old Testament!

We will be taking a hiatus from Sunday school from July 6th thru and including August 3rd. These five weeks will be busy as the teachers take vacations and prepare the choir room for next years 1st thru 4th grade Good Shepherd Atrium.

We will resume our summer curriculum again on August 10th and 17. At this time Miss Jan will be holding orientation for the new 3yr olds that will be attending their first year of the Good Shepherd classes.

Our Good Shepherd Atriums will again open for all of our children for our 4th year on August 24th. Have a wonderful and safe summer and please don't forget to come to church and bring the kids!
