Reconciliation

Traditionally many Christians have participated in confession during Holy Week in order to prepare spiritually for Easter. In the modern Episcopal Church we have two forms of confession. The most widely known is the group confession that we say together each Sunday. There also is a brief service for individual confession known formally as The Reconciliation of a Penitent. Reconciliation in the Episcopal Church is usually done one on one with the priest. If you are interested in Reconciliation, please speak with Pastor Heather.

Palm Sunday Passion Reading

On Palm Sunday we read through the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ during services. Traditionally we have divided the reading into parts. Most of which are read from individuals seats during the service and no experience is necessary. Please sign up to read one of the parts and participate in this moving Palm Sunday experience.

Holy Week

Holy Week contains some of the most moving worship services in the Episcopal Church. If you have not attended these services in the past, I encourage you to join us for at least one of them. Each service during the week takes on special significance based on the events of Jesus' last week.

Palm Sunday 8:30 and 10:30 AM services

Together we remember the crowds that cheered Jesus as he entered Jerusalem. How quickly the crowd would change to chanting "crucify him," as we also read through the passion story of Jesus' last few days.

Mundy Thursday 7 PM service

During this service we reenact Jesus' last night with his disciples through washing each other's feet and remembering His Last Supper. Finally we strip the altar and prepare for the somberness of Good Friday

Good Friday 12 & 7 PM services

We recall Jesus' crucifixion and death through quiet readings and prayers.

Easter Vigil (Saturday) 7 PM

If you are looking for a way to sum up the entire history of God's salvation, this is it! We light the fire of salvation, recall the great deeds God has done throughout history (think great Old Testament stories), remember our calling in baptism, and finally celebrate the resurrection of Jesus!

Easter Sunday 8:30 & 10:30 AM services

We gather together to celebrate Jesus' resurrection and our salvation!

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Jan, Lisa and I have planned the lessons for the Season of Lent, which began on Ash Wednesday, February 13. During Lent in February and March the Good Shepherd's Children will study the Blessed Vessels and Linens used in Eucharistic. They will learn to prepare the cruets for their Children's Eucharist and review the gestures of the Eucharist. The True Vine children will also discuss the Lord's Prayer, Psalm 23rd and the Parables of the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin and the Lost Son.

During the first 5 Sundays of Lent (February 17th through March 24th) both Atriums will continue to start lessons at 9:45AM and will remain there until

the Children's Eucharist, which immediately follows the 10:30 service.

Please support our Good Shepherd Children and stay approximately 15 minutes after the 10:30 Eucharist to watch and listen as they process into church bringing their Blessed Vessels, Linens and Elements to celebrate and worship Jesus their Good Shepherd.

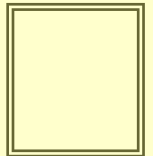
