The good folks of All Saints Church took a step back in time on June ninth in observance of the sixtieth anniversary of our groundbreaking. The freshly rejuvenated parish hall was resplendent in a 1950's motif. The decorations featured table settings adorned by candle-illuminated photographs of past and present parishioners, captured by the camera over the past five decades. Nostalgic smiles graced the faces of those in attendance as they circulated from table to table reminiscing years past, recognizing friends and acquaintances of present and bygone days. The trip down Memory Lane was also documented by archeological artifacts, such as an architect's model of the proposed structure, several issues of the parish directory, and a number of photo boards chronicling parish events, such as baptisms, confirmations, and weddings.

Dinner fare was comprised of a buffet of various casseroles typical of the fifty's, prepared by the devoted hands of parishioners. On display were other epicurean delights of that period in time, including "Tang" – the orange flavored drink created for astronauts, "Spam" – the original mystery meat, and "Minute Rice" – the 1950's housewife's version of "fast food".

Sandy Kynerd provided insight as to the meaning of the red doors, unique to the Episcopal Church. Jan Fritzsche served as "emcee", conducting a trivia quiz for which correct answers were rewarded with everybody's favorite candies of the fifties, including such notables as Dots, Red Hots, Necco Wafers, Sugar Babies, and the ever-popular Teabury Gum. Kids participated in a variety of games popular in the

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pre-video game era. They jumped rope to the cadence of such memorable verses as "Mable, Mable, Set the Table" and "Teddy Bear". They dropped clothes pins in a bottle and demonstrated proficiency with the activity no 1950's tribute could be without – the "Hula Hoop".

Laughter and smiles were the order of the day as parishioners enjoyed their visit with the past, in celebration of our proud heritage and noble tradition of welcoming all into our fold. Many thanks to the caring hands and hearts of those who contributed to the planning and preparation of this joyous event. We were reminded of the fellowship and stewardship that have been our hallmarks for sixty years and provide the foundation for the next sixty years. Heartened by our history, inspired by our faith, let us go forward together to love and serve the Lord. Happy Anniversary, All Saints!

## Stewardship Summer Update

As we celebrate the 60th anniversary of breaking ground at All Saints, it is only natural that we look back at the last 60 years our church has experienced.

Anniversaries are a wonderful opportunity to reflect, treasure and remember memories. Stewardship is just as wonderful an opportunity to reflect on the gifts God has given us, treasure being able to share those gifts with All Saints and to remember what we need for our future,

As we come into the second half of 2013, we find our income is not keeping pace with our expenses, a situation we saw when the budget was presented at our Annual Meeting in January. At this time we

currently have a \$14,000 deficit. Your Vestry has made great strides in reducing expenses.

However, we find it necessary to ask our parishioners to reflect on increasing their pledge, treasure giving a one-time gift or remember All Saints with time and talent by volunteering to perform duties that might otherwise have to be paid. If you can increase your pledge by 5 percent, wonderful. If you can give \$5,000, wonderful. Please consider these requests from your parish with the "Second Half" Pledge Card, which you can pick up at Church. As we celebrate 60 years we might ask ourselves, "Where will we be in 60 (or 30 or 15 or 7) years? How can I help All Saints get there?"

## All Saints Financial Report through May 2013

<b>Expenses</b>	\$64,592.62	\$66,515.12
<b>Difference</b>	-\$20,972.57	-\$17,251.82

From this chart, it can be observed that revenues are down but so are expenses compared to what was budgeted for May 2013. Pledges are down \$4,779.

This does not reflect the Second Pledge Campaign which has and will generate more income for All

Saints. The deficit has been met in two ways: 1) December 2012 was a very good month in terms of pledges and that money carried over into 2013 and 2) withdrawing funds from our Diocesan Investment Account.

We are now in the summer months and many parishioners travel or vacation during this time. Our expenses continue regardless so keeping pledges up to date is a huge help to us. Thank you for all you do for All Saints!!

The All Saints Youth Group has been busy. Among the activities they are involved in:

Most recently, they have been raising funds to attend a mission trip in July. It is called Brother's Keeper and has been a large successful outreach ministry in Ripley, West Virginia at the Parchment Valley Baptist Conference Center. Below is a brief summary from the associated Church website:

*In 2001, a need was recognized for a specific outreach ministry within Jackson County. This need was to assist a sector of the public in maintaining their homes that might not otherwise be able to do so, due to physical or financial hardships. To answer this call, the West Virginia Baptist Convention and its Parchment Valley Conference Center (PVCC), in collaboration with Community Resources, identify suitable recipients.*

*Youth and adults from across West Virginia and*

*Ohio come together at Parchment Valley to participate in this outreach ministry. The students are divided into work crews, and each crew has at least one experienced adult leader. They come from American Baptist Church youth groups, and work to raise money to cover their own registration fee, which is used for housing and meals. Donations are also used from area businesses, individuals and churches, and in some cases, residents have paid for the necessary material and received free labor from Brother's Keeper. The BK crews work on various jobs, including painting, mobile home roof maintenance, porch repair, constructing wheelchair ramps, clearing junk from buildings and more.*

Our youth group is attending along with the youth group from St. Peters Episcopal Church in Lakewood. This is the same church that hosts the homeless sleepout and the youth groups have become friends with each other.

To raise funds for the trip, our youth group has done a flower sale, bake sale and two car washes to minimize the cost of attending and traveling to and from Ripley. Other funds have come from a Tupperware sale and a grant from the diocese.


### ***A Prayer for Summer***
